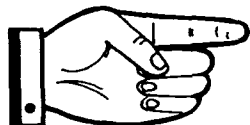

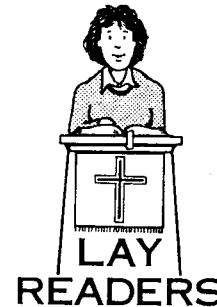

From a Newsletter

In reading a newsletter from a sister church that we received in the mail, I discovered that on Ash Wednesday the Rector asked his congregation to do three things:

1. Give Alms
2. Fast
3. Pray

Giving alms means caring for the poor and working to undo injustices which keep people poor. It is very rewarding to give food, clothing or shelter, but is frustrating to try to address the issues that cause someone to be homeless. He wondered how we could do the more difficult work and change the systems that cause poverty. (The Diocese of Maryland passed a resolution last year which said that every congregation would commit to give 0.7% of its operating budget to help with the Millenium Development Goals (MDGs).)

In fasting, instead of giving up sweets for Lent, how about giving away your own things to others, thus doing without. Think of what we can do without that will enable someone else to live. Lent is a time to focus on all that we have, and in what we can share with others.

The last request is prayer. Spend time daily in prayer. Many people do already but to those who don't, Lent is a good time to start. Give thanks and pray for those in need.
