JUST COME !

I am the Good Shepherd.....

I know my own and my own know me. (John 10: 1-18)

This passage is frequently read as part of the burial service. In that context it gives assurance that our departed are not abandoned by God who knows us each by name. But it contains a deeper meaning that pertains to more than the occasion of the Christian death, namely that Christ is the revelation of the Father. "If you have seen me you have seen the Father." Thus how Christ describes himself is also a description of who God is. God is the Good Shepherd . He is not a shepherd who runs away when his sheep are in trouble or a mere manager who looks on his sheep as so many head worth so much money. It is an image of deep personal love and involvement. A good shepherd knows his own sheep -he knows when one of them is missing. He gives them names (as we all do to the animals we love.) A good shepherd guards his sheep and protects them.

In terms of our own Good Shepherd, this relationship is intensely personal. We are known by name and valued infinitely. We are not left on our own or given over to wolves.
